2020 C.J. Davidson Lecture Series: Advances in Literacy

The speaker for the twenty-fourth annual C. J. Memorial Lecture Series: Advances in Literacy will be Nancy Cushen White, Ed.D. The topics Dr. Cushen White will be presenting are "Best Practices for Teaching Handwriting to Students with Dyslexia and Dysgraphia – From Skills to Functional Use" and "Words with Spelling Connections Have Meaning Connections." The Lecture Series will be held on February 14, 2020 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Scottish Rite Building located at 1101 70th Street in Lubbock, Texas. The registration fee is \$50.00 and seating is limited. For those that are members of ALTA, 5 CEU credits will be offered for attending. Nancy Cushen White, Ed.D., is a Clinical Professor, Department of Pediatrics, Division of Adolescent and Young Adult Medicine, at the University of CA-San Francisco (UCSF). Over the past 40+ years, she has taught students in general/special education classrooms at public/private schools, provided psycho-educational assessment and literacy intervention, trained pre-/in-service teachers and practitioners, developed curricula, and been involved in policy. She piloted a San Francisco Unified School District special day class for 2e—Twice Exceptional students who were gifted with a



diagnosis of dyslexia and has taught young adults in a pre-trial diversion program through San Francisco Superior Court—Mentor Court Division.

Dr. Cushen White is a Certified Academic Language Therapist, Qualified Instructor, and a Licensed Dyslexia Therapist. She is also a certified Instructor of Teaching for training teachers in the Slingerland Multisensory (Multimodal) Structured Language Approach (Structured Literacy).

She has received awards from organizations such as the Slingerland Institute for Literacy (2000—Beth and John Slingerland Award), UC Berkeley Extension (2002—Honored Instructor Award), International Dyslexia Association (IDA—2007—Margaret Byrd Rawson Lifetime Achievement Award), International Multisensory Structured Language Education Council (IMSLEC—2014—Etoile DuBard Award of Excellence), Academic Language Therapy Association (ALTA—2016—Dr. Lucius Waites Award of Service), and Northern California Branch of The International Dyslexia Association (IDA-NorCal—2019—Recognition of Extraordinary Leadership and Accomplishment). She continues to publish, present workshops, serve as editor of IDA's Examiner (online newsletter), and work on numerous boards and advisory boards such as the National Joint Committee on Learning Disabilities (NJCLD) and the Northern California Branch of The International Dyslexia Association.



IMSLEC School Recognition

The Scottish Rite Learning Center of West Texas is one of six schools in the country to receive special recognition from The Multisensory Structured Language Education Council (IMSLEC). This recognition "signifies the school administration and staff are committed to increasing student achievement by implementing multisensory structured, language education as taught in IMSLEC Accredited Teacher/Therapy Training courses." The faculty of the Learning Center consists of eight Certified Academic Language Therapists, five of whom are Qualified Instructors and one who is in Qualified Instructor training. Introductory Therapist Training - Lubbock Campus



In June, twenty-five teachers began the Dyslexia Therapist Training course at the Scottish Rite Learning Center of West Texas in Lubbock. This class, the largest class since 1998, had four teachers from Lubbock ISD, seven from Lubbock-Cooper ISD, three from Plainview ISD, two from Sundown ISD and one from each of the following school districts: Hale Center, Tahoka, Albany, Harmony Science, Lamesa, Smyer, Andrews, Shallowater and Roosevelt. These ladies

attended their first seminar on October 4, 2019 and as a whole they are currently teaching seventy-five classes and two hundred thirty-three students.

Introductory Therapist Training - Amarillo Campus

The Scottish Rite Learning Center of West Texas, Amarillo Campus, had seven teachers to begin the Dyslexia Therapist Training Course in June. This class had teachers from Happy ISD, Dumas ISD, Texhoma ISD, Friona ISD, River Road ISD, Miami ISD and Betty M. Condra School in Lubbock, Texas. These ladies are teaching fourteen classes and forty-six students.



Advanced Therapist Training - Lubbock Campus



The Advanced Training Class will complete their training in May of 2020, and be eligible to take the Alliance Exam to become a Certified Academic Language Therapist (CALT). This class consists of nine teachers from Lubbock ISD, three from Lubbock-Cooper ISD, two from Midland ISD and one from each of the following school districts: Andrews, Brownfield, Frenship, Plainview, San Jacinto Christian School (Amarillo), All Saints Episcopal School and Trinity Christian

Schools (Lubbock). It will be our pleasure to recognize these ladies at the annual Graduation Ceremony on May 3, 2020.

Semiannual Visit From Lubbock Christian University Clinical Teachers

LCU professor, Annette Mahon, M.Ed. and 6 of her clinical teaching students visited the Scottish Rite Learning Center of West Texas the afternoon of September 18, 2019. The students, who are currently student teaching in the Frenship ISD schools, attended a presentation by Toni Parrish which focused on the characteristics of dyslexia, the Texas State Laws, and the identification of students with dyslexia. Mrs. Parrish's presentation assists in complying with the Texas Administrative Code TAC §228.30 and the Texas Education Code TEC §21.044 both of which are state laws requiring a teacher training course to include characteristics, identification, and strategies for teaching students with dyslexia. The lecture is required to obtain a teacher education certificate. After the presentation, the students observed a Take Flight daily lesson taught by SRLCWT therapist, Olive Hester. It is always a pleasure to have Mrs. Mahon and her students visit the Center.
