# The Learning Center Will Soon Offer BUILD Training



#### What is BUILD?

To meet the specific needs of Kindergarten and first grade students who have been identified at-risk for dyslexia, the staff of the Luke Waites Center for Dyslexia and Learning Disorders at Scottish Rite for Children has developed a 100-lesson reading intervention called *Build: A K-1 Early Reading Intervention*.

#### Who may attend BUILD training?

Any certified teacher, dyslexia interventionist, or CALT is eligible to attend BUILD Training and implement this intervention with K-1 students.

#### What about Continuing Education Hours?

All attendees will be offered 6 ALTA CEUs

#### What is the cost?

The SRLCWT training session is \$125. Starting in July 2022, BUILD kits will be offered through the Scottish Rite for Children portal for \$750. *The purchase of a kit is required to attend BUILD Training.*

Both the Lubbock and Amarillo campuses will offer a one-day training on:

**Haley Carson** 


Dyslexia Therapist


