SCOTTISH RITE

Turbo Start: A Comprehensive Dyslexia Intervention Curriculum for Newly Identified Students

with Dyslexia (Turbo Start was previously known as Rite Start)

Turbo Start is a 9-week evidence-based dyslexia intervention that provides a jump start for students of all ages with dyslexia, who require comprehensive intervention while awaiting placement in an intervention group. It offers one-on-one or small group instruction (of no more than 6 students) and covers the five components of Effective Reading Instruction, such as phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and reading comprehension. The curriculum is taught using a direct, systematic, cumulative, multisensory method of introduction and practice to meet specific needs of newly identified students with dyslexia. **Training information coming soon!**

Features:

- Taught by a Certified Academic Language Therapist
- Provides foundational training in five specific components of reading intervention
- Each component is taught developmentally
- Flexibility in the intervention timeline to prepare students to enter dyslexia in a group setting
- Four days a week (60 minutes per day) or five days a week (45 minutes per day)

Key Findings:

- Turbo Start is designed to enable students who are newly identified and ready to begin dyslexia intervention to drop in at any time until a group is formed
- It draws content from the evidence-based Take Flight curriculum
- Turbo Start introduces content from the first two books of Take Flight lesson cycle sequence.

Nancy Mather, PhD. Professor Emerita, University of Arizona

2023 Samuel Torrey Orton Award Recipient

Nancy Mather, Ph.D. Guest Lecturer

Nancy Mather is a Professor Emerita at the University of Arizona in Tucson. She has served as a learning disabilities teacher, a diagnostician, a university professor, and an educational consultant. She has published numerous articles and books and conducts workshops on assessment and instruction both nationally and internationally. Her most recent book on dyslexia is *Essentials of Dyslexia: Assessment and Intervention*, 2nd ed. (Mather & Wendling, 2024). She is a co-author of several widely used tests, including the *Woodcock-Johnson IV* and the *Test of Orthographic Competence* (2nd ed.).

In addition, Dr. Mather and her co-authors have recently completed the *Tests* of *Dyslexia* (Mather, McCallum, Bell, & Wendling, 2024), a comprehensive assessment that is designed to help identify dyslexia in individuals of all ages. Dr. Mather recently received the 2023 Samuel Torrey Orton Award from the International Dyslexia Association for her contributions concerning the identification and remediation dyslexia.
